The 2021 Show Is A Go!

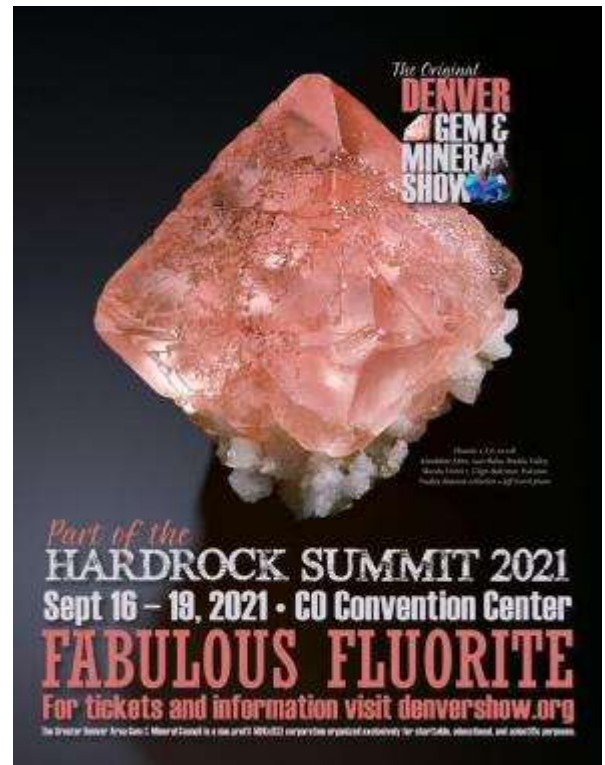
The Greater Denver Area Gem & Mineral Council is pleased to announce that it will be hosting the 2021 Denver Gem & Mineral Show in conjunction with the Hardrock Summit, to be held at the Colorado Convention Center September 16-19, 2021.

The closing of the Denver Mart necessitated that we find a new venue. Numerous ideas were floated and organizers from a number of shows generously offered us space. The Council and Show Committee decided that the Hardrock Summit was the best fit, allowing the Original Denver Gem & Mineral Show to retain its identity and include some of the defining aspects of our show and organization.

The new high end Evolution show (Sept 16-19) as well AGTA Denver (Sept 18-21) will also fall under the Hardrock Summit umbrella, providing marketing potential that the Denver Gem & Mineral Show cannot offer as a stand-alone show.

The Denver Gem & Mineral Show will occupy the space on the upper, entry level of the Convention Center. The 2021 show will include club tables, speakers, special exhibits, and 40 to 70 dealers. Everything will be scaled back as a result of space limitations; we are nonetheless grateful for the opportunity to be part of the debut year of the Hardrock Summit, which is positioned to be Denver's premier gem, mineral, and fossil show.

We wanted to get the news to you as quickly as possible and have not had a chance to update our websites or social media, but in the coming weeks, we invite you to visit hardrocksummit.com and denvershow.org for more details about this exciting new event, our organization, and plans for the future.



Geology Corner

From the February 2021 issue of World War II magazine

Polish divers hope to have solved the 75-year-old mystery surrounding the fate of the legendary “Amber Room” – Czar Peter the Great’s priceless 18th-century chamber decorated with amber, gold, and jewels that vanished after being stolen by the Nazis during the war.

The divers located the wreck of the German steamer Karlsruhe 290 feet deep in the Baltic Sea near the Polish seaside town of Ustka. They identified the ship on September 24 by its distinctive bow.

Soviet planes sank the Karlsruhe on April 13, 1945, with more than 1,000 German troops and civilians evacuating from the city of Kaliningrad, Russia on board. Only 113 survived.

While several historians believe the Amber Room was destroyed during the final bombardment of Kaliningrad in April 1945, the divers think the missing treasures – looted from the Russian palace outside St. Petersburg and crated up and taken to Kaliningrad, maybe stashed in sealed chests in the ship’s hold.

Tomasz Stachura, who led the dive team, told the online travel magazine Atlas Obscura that “we do not have any hard evidence that the Amber Room is there, but nobody has any hard evidence that the Amber Room is elsewhere. The truth is that the Germans wanting to send something valuable to the west could only do it by means of Karlsruhe, as this was the last chance.”

The wreck is mostly intact; however, diving to the deep site is physically demanding and “very difficult”, Stachura said. It’s unclear when the cargo might be salvaged. Stachura said it depends on Polish maritime



authorities.

Field Trip News

LGMC 2021 FIELD TRIPS

This is the list of the LGMC 2021 field trips. Due to the continuing presence of the Covid-19 virus, please continue to exercise good judgement and be respectful of others. Please bring/wear a face mask for the times when it is appropriate (in the vicinity of other people). There will be other times when you will not need to wear your mask (when digging by yourself, away from other people). Some mask rules have been relaxed, especially for those who have been through the complete vaccination process. Again, use good judgement and respect others.

For all field trips, bring a backpack with rain gear, gloves, tools, water, lunch, and sunscreen. Some people bring a 5-gallon bucket for equipment and to use as a stool to sit on (and to carry specimen back to vehicle). Appropriate field boots are strongly suggested. Do not recommend tennis shoes. Wear a good sun-protecting hat.

If any trip has limitations on the number of participants, this will be designated. Registration for all trips will be done On-Line, through the Google Form attached to this notice. Registration will be on a “first come, first served” basis, and the running total of members enrolled for each trip will be listed as people sign up. Names

will continue to be added to the list, even past the cut-off limit, in the event that someone who is initially signed up has to cancel. If this occurs, the person next in line will be offered that position on the trip.

We ask that each person/family travel in their own vehicle. No carpooling, please. Also, since the number of people on some trips may be limited, we ask that only LGMC Members attend the trips---no non-member guests, unless individually approved.

Many of the Club members have been on one or more of these trips, and hopefully are familiar with how to get to the respective Meeting Places. If you enroll in any particular trip, and are not familiar with where to go, please email Jim Hooten (jahooten@msn.com) and request a copy of a map showing directions.

FIELD TRIPS:

Sat., May 22, 2021, WESTERN MINING MUSEUM. Near Colorado Springs. No limit on number of participants. Trip leader Jim Hooten (jahooten@msn.com, 303-548-7412).

I have arranged an “educational” Field Trip to the Western Mining Museum, located on the northern edge of Colorado Springs, just off of I-25, near the Air Force Academy (225 North Gate Blvd). Sorry, but no actual mineral collecting on this trip....educational only, but very interesting. There have been 7 members already signed up after the initial announcement last month.

Please read over the below description, and, if interested, please sign up through the LGMC website (field trips). More information is available on the [Western Mining Museum website](#).

Our Tour will start at 10:00 A.M., so please arrive a little early (9:45 +/-). They say the tour duration is approximately 1 hour, with an optional movie on Mining History that is possible, adding an additional 30 minutes. The tour is led by a very knowledgeable Docent. The public hours are 10:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. You can stay and visit further if so desired. **The tour covers** the mining history of Colorado and the American West, with a new exhibit specifically on the mining history of Colorado Springs. The general Tour features mining machinery, interactive exhibits, a model mining drift, a gold panning station, and more....all within the 12,200 square foot exhibit hall.

There is a charge for attendance:

Adult (18 and older) -- \$11 per person (\$10 if 15 or more participants)

Seniors (65 and older) -- \$9 per person (\$8 if 15 or more participants)

Children (under age 18) -- \$8 per person (\$7 if 15 or more participants)

Sat., May 29, 2021---DEVIL’S HEAD, near Sedalia, CO. NO LIMIT ON NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS. Trip leaders Travis Leach and Stacey Lestina. Any questions, call Stacey at 303-241-6670. Smoky quartz, topaz, fluorite, etc. **Meet at large parking lot (on the right) just inside the entrance to Rampart Range Road, at the intersection of Rampart Range Road and CO 67, at 9:00 A.M.** Trip leaders will lead caravan to collecting locality. Drive to Sedalia, south of Littleton, on Hwy 85. Turn west on CO Hwy 67 and go approximately 12 miles to Rampart Range Road (turn left, south, off of Hwy 67). Parking lot is first right.

Dist = 35 miles

4WD = No

Kids = OK

Tools = D, H

Fee = None

Sat., June 12, 2021---Smoky Hawk Mine, Joe Dorris Claim (near Lake George). LIMIT OF 50 PARTICIPANTS. Trip Leader Jim Hooten. Owner Joe Dorris has again invited us to try our luck at collecting some of the beautiful amazonite and smoky quartz specimens that are famous from this area. Of course, no guarantees of finding any minerals, but always a guaranteed good time! **Meeting Time: 9:00 A.M.** **Meeting Place:** Drive into Lake George, CO on Hwy 24, west from Colorado Springs (approx 35 miles west of Colorado Springs). As you come into the east side of town, you’ll see a paved road going off to the right (north)...**Park County Road 94.** Turn right onto CR 94 and park along the side of the road, near the Ranger Station, just a short distance off of the highway. Give yourself plenty of time to get there, as it is a good 2-hour drive from Denver. Bring water, a lunch, and plenty of sunscreen. Also bring some cash, credit card, or checkbook, as Joe has some very nice, representative specimens for sale, at deeply discounted prices. This helps

him make up for his costs in making his claim available to our club, and other clubs as well. From the Meeting Place, we will caravan 15 minutes to the Claim. Most vehicle parking at the Claim will be at the base of a steep, rough road, and people will then walk up the road to the Claim site for an introductory talk from Joe. A few vehicles will be allowed to drive up the hill (parking is very limited up top), and take people who have walking difficulty. For those who do drive up the hill, they ask that you be watchful of Joe's dog, Otis, who likes to run around.

Dist = 100 miles 4WD = Opt Kids = Sup Tools = D, H Fee = None

Sat., June 26, 2021---Topaz Mountain Mine, Joe Dorris Claim (north of Lake George).

LIMIT OF 50 PARTICIPANTS. Trip Leader Jim Hooten. Joe Dorris has again invited us to their Topaz Mountain topaz claim. This is an operational mine, so some different rules apply. It is required that each individual, or family, purchase a bag of gravel for \$50 to help defray the costs for operations and facilities. Each bag will contain several topaz specimens, and possibly some amazonite and smoky quartz pieces as well. In addition, everyone can work the gravel dumps for topaz. While working these dumps, you are working for Glacier Peak Mining. Joe will assess ALL topaz found, and decide whether to release the specimen to the finder, or retain as a "company stone". Some stones may be offered to the finder with an option to purchase at a fair wholesale rate. If any stone(s) is exceptional, the company has the right to retain that specimen.

Although some rakes are available for use at the location, it is suggested you bring a garden rake with heavy tines, and a mattock or shovel. Optional items to bring include a screen, rock pick, collecting bags and a 5-gal bucket. Also bring plenty of water, lunch and sunscreen. Restroom facilities are available.

Meet at 9:00 A.M. directly at the mine. Follow these directions: From Colorado Springs, take U.S. Highway 24 west to Lake George. Drive through Lake George, cross the South Platte River and turn north on Park County Road 77 (Tarryall Road). Go approximately 7 miles. Turn right onto road and cross bridge over Tarryall Creek. You'll see the brown Forest Service sign marking the road (F.S. Road 211) also known as Matakak Road. Proceed about 2.5 miles and pass over cattle guard. You are now on Topaz Mtn Gem Mine. Operating sign is posted on fence to your left. Park in pullout on right, or anywhere along the road. Walk up to where operations are going on. You should see plenty of people and vehicles.

Dist = 120 miles 4WD = Opt Kids = Sup Tools = L Fee = \$50/person or fam

Sat., July 10, 2021---Hartsel Barite Area, near Hartsel, CO. LIMIT OF 40 PARTICIPANTS.

Trip Leader Jim Hooten. Clear to blue to opaque barite crystals. Fun trip and everyone is guaranteed to leave with a bag full of barite. Easy collecting area. **Meet at 10:00 A.M. at Bayou Salado Trading Post in Hartsel (west edge of town).** You can get to Hartsel by either taking CO Hwy 24 west from Colorado Springs (approx. 65 miles) ---plus another 65 from Denver to CoSpr; or by taking CO Hwy 285 southwest from Denver to Fairplay (approx. 85 miles), then turn south on Hwy 9 just west of Fairplay and go 17 miles south to Hartsel. We'll check in with the owners of Bayou Salado, Dave & Lark Harvey, and sign waiver forms, then caravan to collection location a few miles away. Bring lunch, plenty of water, sunscreen and insect spray.

Dist = 105 miles (Hwy 285) / 140 miles (Hwy 24) 4WD = Opt Kids = Sup Tools = D, L Fee = Group Fee (Club pays)

Sat., July 17, 2021---LGMC Honey Bee/Queen Bee Club Claim. Trip Leader – TBD. Amazonite, smoky quartz, fluorite, etc. **Meet at 9:00 A.M. at Community Center in "downtown" Harris Park.** Cars will then caravan to the collection site. Easy walk from final parking area. **Directions:** To get to Harris Park, take U.S. Hwy 285 southwest from Denver approximately 30 miles. Go through Conifer, then Pine Jct., then about another 4 miles until you come to a stop light at the junction of State Road 43 (can only go right—north). Turn north onto State Road 43 (may also be called 43A), and drive about 10 miles to Harris Park. The only potentially confusing point is where Road 43 turns to Road 47, maybe 6-7 miles up the highway. Just stay on the primary paved road (keep to right) and it will take you to Harris Park. The Community Center is the only "large" building around. Everything else is individual homes/cabins.

Dist = 50 miles 4WD = Opt Kids = Sup Tools = D Fee = None

Fri., July 23 to Monday, July 26---Montana Collecting areas (Crystal Peak, etc.). Trip Leader: Lynette Warren (303-956-4634) and Ed & Susan Wakefield (702-613-0545). LGMC members heading north to collect at great amethyst location in southwest Montana. If any other LGMC members are interested in joining them, call either leader for additional information.

Sat., July 31, 2021---Magnetite Ridge, near Tarryall, CO (Park County). Magnetite crystals Trip Leader: Jim Hooten. A fairly new trip destination (first time in 2018). Many who attended commented on how much fun they had, and to keep this trip on the regular field trip schedule. It is located just a few miles north of the Topaz Mtn Claim (see 6/26/2021 trip), just off of Hwy 77 near Tarryall. Follow the directions from the Topaz Mtn trip and continue north on Hwy 77 (past the turnoff to Topaz Mtn) for another 5 miles. Just before getting to Tarryall, CO, you will see County Road 31 going to your left (south). Take CR 31 and go approx. 0.7 miles and turn right onto CR 652. Drive another approximate 0.7 miles to where you park your vehicle along the side of the road. The pine-covered ridge to your left (south), through a grove of aspens, is Magnetite Ridge. It is a fairly easy walk up to the collecting area. All along the ridge you will find exposures of magnetite within the granite pegmatite. Plenty of prospective areas to investigate and collect. You will see many holes where other clubs and collectors have dug. This is all BLM Land, and is open to the public. Camping is permitted anywhere, but all vehicles cannot be driven more than 20 feet from the road. If you want to campout, you can either camp close to your vehicle, or carry your camping gear up the hill closer to the collecting locality.

Meeting Place: Follow the above directions, and Meet at the collecting locality. **Meeting Time:** **meet at 10:00 A.M.**

Dist = 100 miles 4WD = Opt Kids = Sup Tools = D, H Fee = None

Sat., August 21, 2021---Teller County Tourmaline, near Cripple Creek, CO. Schorl tourmaline. Trip Leader: Jim Hooten. Dig, or surface collect, black tourmaline on open BLM land. **Directions:** take CO Highway 24 west from Colorado Springs to Florissant, CO. At Florissant, turn left (south) onto Teller County Road 1. Drive approximately 10 miles south. You will see a llama ranch on your left. Next to the llama ranch is a group of buildings. This is **Evergreen Station...Meet at 10:00 A.M. in the adjacent parking area.** We will then caravan a short distance to the collecting area.

Dist = 100 miles 4WD = Rec Kids = Sup Tools = D, H Fee = None

Sat., Sept. 11, 2021---Purple Dragon Claim (aka Red Feather Lakes) (north of Ft. Collins). Trip Leader: Jim Hooten. Quartz varieties: clear, iron-stained, purple amethyst. Thanks again to new owners, Mandi and William Hutchinson for allowing us to collect on their claim. The LGMC has had a great time with past visits to this historic collecting locale. **Meet at 9:00 A.M. at Livermore, CO (approximately 24 miles north of Ft. Collins), at the intersection of Hwy 287 and County Road 74E (Red Feather Lakes road).**

After collecting all Waiver Forms, the cars will then caravan from there to the collection site, approximately another 28 miles west. The Claim owners have reserved the option to evaluate any amethyst specimen found on their claim, and can retain the crystal if it is of exceptional value.

Tip: To avoid having to drive through Ft. Collins, an easier way to Livermore is to stay on I-25 through Ft. Collins and go another approximate 12 miles north to Exit 281 (Owl Canyon Road). Exit I-25 and go left (west) on CR 70 approximately 10 miles to Hwy 287 (last couple of miles is well-maintained dirt road). Turn right (north) and Livermore is only 2 miles up the highway.

Dist = 125 miles 4WD = Opt Kids = Sup Tools = D, H Fee = None

Sat., Oct. 9, 2021---LGMC Honey Bee/Queen Bee Club Claim. An Autumn return visit to our Club Claim. Beautiful time of the year to dig for more minerals. See information previously posted for **July 17, 2021.**

Field Trip Legend:

Dist= approx.. one way driving distance to meeting place from metro area.

4WD = **No**, not needed; **Opt**, optional (useful if you have one, may need to ride short distance with someone if you don't); **Rec**, recommended; **Yes**, required.

Kids = **OK**, a good place for kids; **Sup**, some potentially hazardous areas (steep cliffs, mine tunnels, etc.). Small children will require supervision. **NR** = Not recommended to bring kids.

Tools = **L**, light collecting tools (rock pick, shovel, sack, scoop); **D**, typical pegmatite digging tools (rock pick, pick and shovel, pry bar, chisels, trowel, brush, screwdriver probe, etc.); **H**, tools for heavy rock breaking (rock pick, sledge, chisels, pry bar, eye protection, etc.).

Camping = if noted, camping (optional for an overnight stay) is possible at the site.

Fee = Noted, if any.

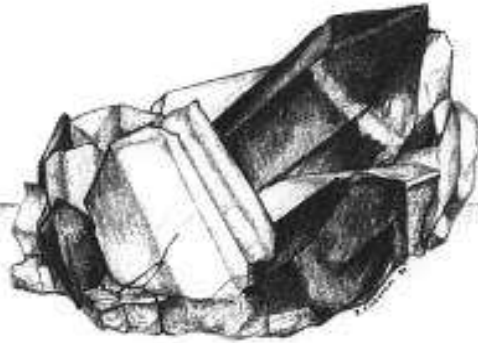
